

## Minutes of the meeting of

### **THE SCOTTISH ARCHAEOLOGICAL FINDS ALLOCATION PANEL**

10:30, Friday 24<sup>th</sup> November 2023, Chambers Street, Edinburgh, EH1 1JF

#### **1. Welcome and Apologies**

JR welcomed PT

EF informed the meeting that that the Annual Report is complete, but that the review team requested that the report be delayed to the new year to allow for a larger debut. JR and LB advised that, in the interests of transparency, publication should not be delayed. JR suggested that it be released to link with the Treasure Trove edition of Archaeology Scotland.

#### **2. Minutes of the Last Meeting and Actions – August 2023**

JR asked about sending details of complicated cases before the meeting, EF confirmed a template had been created for future meetings.

All other actions have been followed through

#### **3. Chair – news and current issues**

JR confirmed the appointment of MH for a second term

JR thanked EF for resolving the delay and getting minutes on to the website.

#### **4. TTU Report – EF**

EF updated the meeting on the Applecross stones case: next steps will be to transfer the fragments of carved stone reasonably believed to be part of the stone in Applecross Heritage Centre and, separately, to claim the fragments that cannot be reasonably linked to the original stone. This has been agreed with the KLTR department. EF acknowledged the excellent report written by Janel Fontaine (TTU) on the case.

It was noted that Applecross Heritage Centre is not an accredited museum.

Action from August 2023 meeting required EF to provide information on rallies. EF explained that rallies are a known unknown – the events are happening, but TTU is not necessarily informed, and the number of artefacts being found at events is unknown.

JR observed the need for anticipation of rallies for planning work programs and workloads, EF concurred and explained the difficulties with this, including issues such as rally organisers keeping the location secret until the day of the event, and the unknown number of attendees and artefacts that might be recovered. LB asked if TTU knew the reporting gap from rallies specifically; EF explained that TTU do not have enough data to estimate.

JR requested that planned outreach should be discussed at the next meeting, **(ACTION: EF to prepare a list of planned outreach to be sent before each SAFAP meeting)**.

JR suggested that numbers for these and for find processing should be provided in writing before SAFAP meetings in a structured template, FH thanked JR for the suggestion as he and EF had been discussing this **(ACTION: EF to provide data on finds reporting and processing before each SAFAP meeting)**.

## **Outreach**

EF listed the events since SAFAP August 2023:

**Shetland and Orkney:** Finds days at Shetland Museum and Archives, The Orkney Museum and The Old Haa museum (Yell). Trip to Westray Heritage Centre for meeting with centre trustees.

**Aberdeenshire:** Aberdeen City Art Gallery finds event, with all Aberdeenshire museums were present. TTU met with finders.

**Highland Archaeology Festival (Inverness):** Finds day and museum visits to Cromarty Courthouse, Nairn Museum, and Elgin Museum to deliver and pick up finds.

**Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum:** Finds day

**Montrose Museum:** Finds day

**Big Scottish Rally and Detectormania:** Across two rallies, roughly 400 people in attendance.

**Glasgow University Seminar:** GP gave a lesson in the Masters course in Museum Studies.

**Couriering:** West Highland Museum, Paisley Museum and Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum

**Detecting clubs:** Scottish Detector Club

JR suggested that it would be useful to have the report on outreach also before each SAFAP meeting, EF agreed **(ACTION: EF to provide a report on completed outreach before each SAFAP meeting)**.

## **Backlog**

EF explained that the backlog has dropped in the last 40 weeks from roughly 6,000 objects to roughly 1,300. JR suggested that LB might advise on the most useful data and possible

forecasting. LB and EF agreed. **(ACTION: LB and EF, to analyse the data around the reduction of backlog and application to demand for the future).**

The Panel also discussed how the progress can be made public, and suggested the Annual Report would be ideal. SW also suggested that shorter, more regular reporting could be useful online. TTU to consider.

JR summed up the picture as very positive, and that the challenge now is to keep demand and capacity in balance through resourcing. This is a key point for the Review.

SW congratulated TTU team to general agreement.

## 5. NMS Report

FH said that NMS have been continuing to support TTU work and reported on a recent excavation. EF explained the timeline for processing these artefacts through the TT system.

BS asked EF to clarify procedure for TT excavations, and KM asked about what constitutes a hoard. EF and FH explained the definition of a hoard is a set of objects which have been deliberately deposited in the same location and explained procedures around excavating them, FH explained the value of fieldwork for context when hoards and significant finds are found.

## 6. AOCB

JR referenced correspondence from Neil Curtis (University of Aberdeen) regarding recent conflicting application cases that were not allocated to the University, and the panel's reasoning for this. Panel discussed how to respond and how to deal with conflicting application cases going forward, including the level of information provided to the unsuccessful applicant and encouraging more discussion between applicants by sharing application paperwork. SW suggested that a face-to-face discussion with Neil Curtis would be beneficial, and panel agreed. **(ACTION: JR to set up a meeting with Neil Curtis).**

KM asked about how museums of last resort function, EF explained that they are informed of cases which have had no applications in the first round of applications, and are then able to apply for these cases.

JR asked for a list of museums of last resort and asked if they have a formal status, EF said that there is no formal status, but that the informal status is conferred on request. MH and FH concurred **(ACTION: EF to provide a list of museums of last resort for the panel).**

## 7. Cases for discussion

*MH left the room*

**TT 287/22:** Hoard of Post-Medieval Coins – EF explained that the finder submitted comparanda and TTU undertook an external valuation for the panel to consider. Panel discussed all of the comparanda and recommended that £10,845 was a fair *ex gratia* award.

**TT 64/23:** Early to Late Medieval excavation assemblage – Contested between National Museums Scotland (NMS) and Historic Environment Scotland (HES).

The panel reviewed the supporting statements from both institutions and discussed research and display potential, along with storage and access. Assemblage integrity was also considered.
