Introduction

Treasure Trove in Scotland operates at a fascinating interface between history, law, archaeological fieldwork, public engagement and museum practice. All these aspects are reflected in the work of the Treasure Trove Unit and Scottish Archaeological Finds Allocation Panel (SAFAP), as advisers to the King's and Lord Treasurer's Remembrancer (KLTR)

The underlying principle of Treasure Trove is that the Crown is the ultimate owner of moveable property that has been abandoned or where no rights of ownership have been exercised for 20 years or more. Such items become the property of the Crown, irrespective of the material – so Treasure is not limited to gold, silver or precious metal, but can include pottery and other domestic items of historic interest.

The Treasure Trove Unit (TTU) is responsible for the daily running of the Treasure Trove system and is the first port of call for new discoveries and finders. It assesses objects and, where appropriate, findspots.

TTU has delegated authority from the KLTR to decide whether an object should be claimed as Treasure Trove or not.

If an object is claimed, it will appear before SAFAP and accredited Scottish museums are invited to apply for the cases. The TTU provides a report and estimated valuation to the panel to use in deciding the level of ex gratia award for the finder. The finder also has the opportunity to provide the panel with information regarding the suitable level of ex gratia payment. SAFAP normally meets three times a year to consider the cases referred by the TTU. SAFAP's conclusions on allocation and the level of ex gratia award at each meeting are put to the KLTR as recommendations for their decision.

This report covers Treasure Trove matters dealt with by the TTU and SAFAP from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024.

Report by the Chair of SAFAP

This was an important and positive year for the operation of Treasure Trove as we have continued to build on recent experience, explore new ideas and see some very positive results.

Panel activity

The Panel met three times during the year, undertaking the usual formal business and with more general discussion, particularly in considering the independent Review of Treasure Trove in Scotland which was commissioned by the KLTR and formally launched in September 2023.

As is now usual, meetings of the Panel were in person but with the opportunity to join remotely. Minutes of the meetings, as approved at the following meeting, are posted on the website. Full details of the allocation decisions taken at each meeting are included in Appendix 1 of this Annual Report.

Panel membership

Early in the year we worked with the Scottish Government Public Bodies Unit to conduct an open recruitment process for new Panel members, whose appointment is made by Scottish Ministers. I was very pleased to welcome the appointments of Dr Sharon Webb of Kilmartin Museum as a new professional member and Lily Rose Bell as a new independent member, as well as the reappointment of professional member Dr Mark Hall of Perth Museum. Together they bring a wealth of relevant experience, and individually and collectively all panel members have made extremely effective contributions throughout the year.

TTU activity

During the reporting year the TTU have made real progress in addressing the backlog of pre-2022 cases, with result that the vast majority is now clear and staff can prioritise more current cases. TTU staff have also re-engaged in a programme of outreach to regional museums and the metal detecting community, raising mutual awareness. In addition, the manager of the TTU and SAFAP chair both contributed articles to the winter 2023 edition of Archaeology Scotland's members' magazine, aimed at reaching a wider professional community.

Even with all this activity, the numbers of items for processing remain significant, as reporting is now increased to levels far exceeding those pre-COVID. This volume of reporting is a welcome indicator of overall confidence, and of the value of the dedicated time, effort and resources of all involved, but it

presents a challenge to ensure there is no build-up of a new backlog. The aim of TTU/ SAFAP is to reduce turnaround time from reporting to completion of the process (by allocation or disclaiming) to 12 months. New internal arrangements, with TTU staff having a regional portfolio, are already having a positive impact, and time efficiency has been a theme of many helpful contributions to the forthcoming Review, due to report by the autumn of 2024.

Last year's report set out, for the first time, some objectives for the TTU. This year's Report provides a summary of progress against those objectives and an indication of what is in train for 2024/5. Treasure Trove is a system which has survived and evolved over many years and all of us involved are respectful of what has been developed to date, but equally enthused to see what more can be achieved using modern technology and methods. So, I am sure 2024/5 will be another very positive year as we make continued internal progress and see the recommendations of the Review for 2025 onwards.



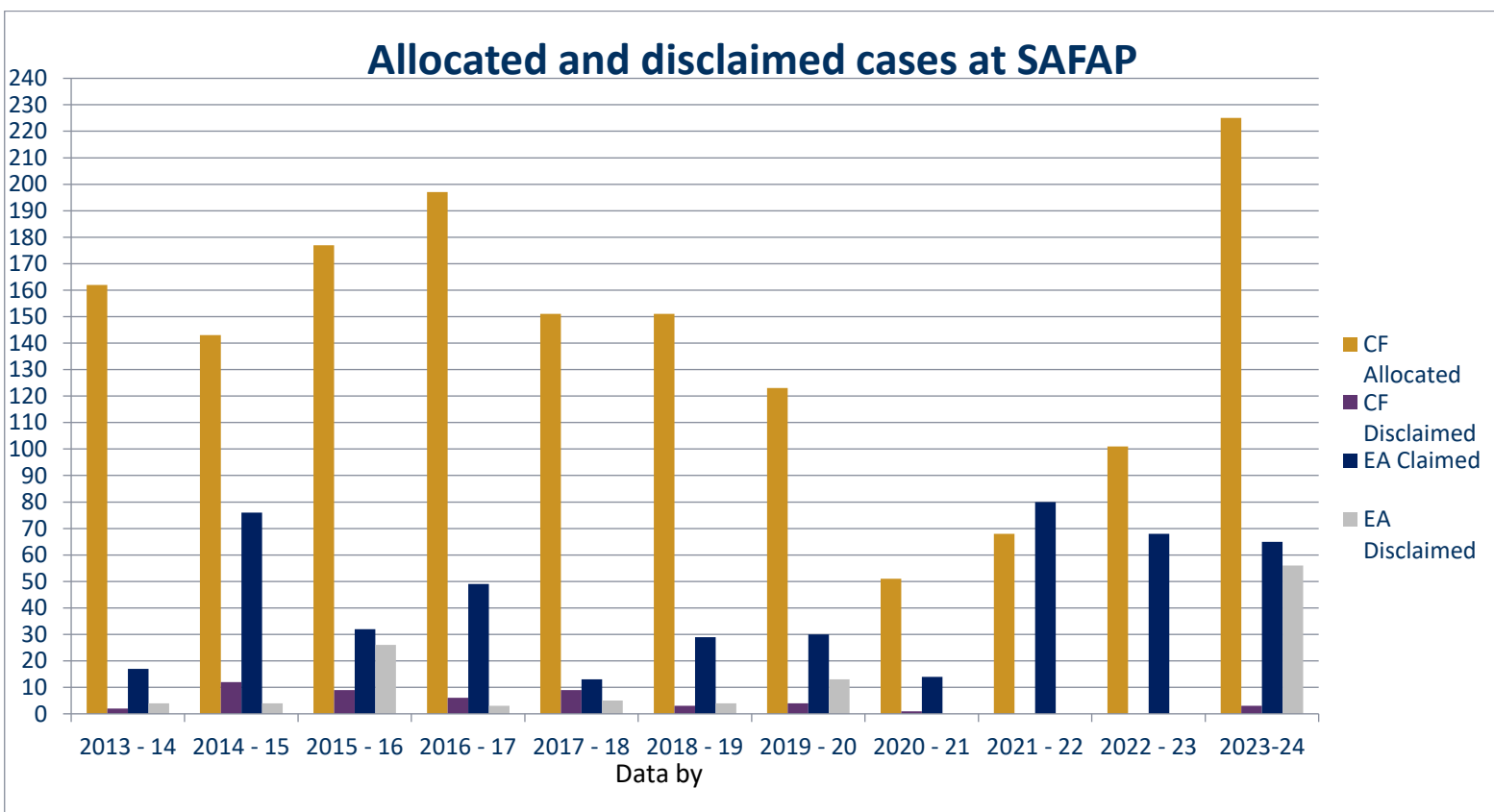

Work of the Treasure Trove Unit

Statistics

Appendix 1 lists the finds claimed as Treasure Trove, with information as to each findspot and where the object was allocated.

In this period the panel held its three meetings in April, August and November 2023. In total, SAFAP dealt with 228 cases of chance finds made by members of the public; 3 cases were disclaimed at panel. These cases were primarily artefacts handed in before the pandemic.



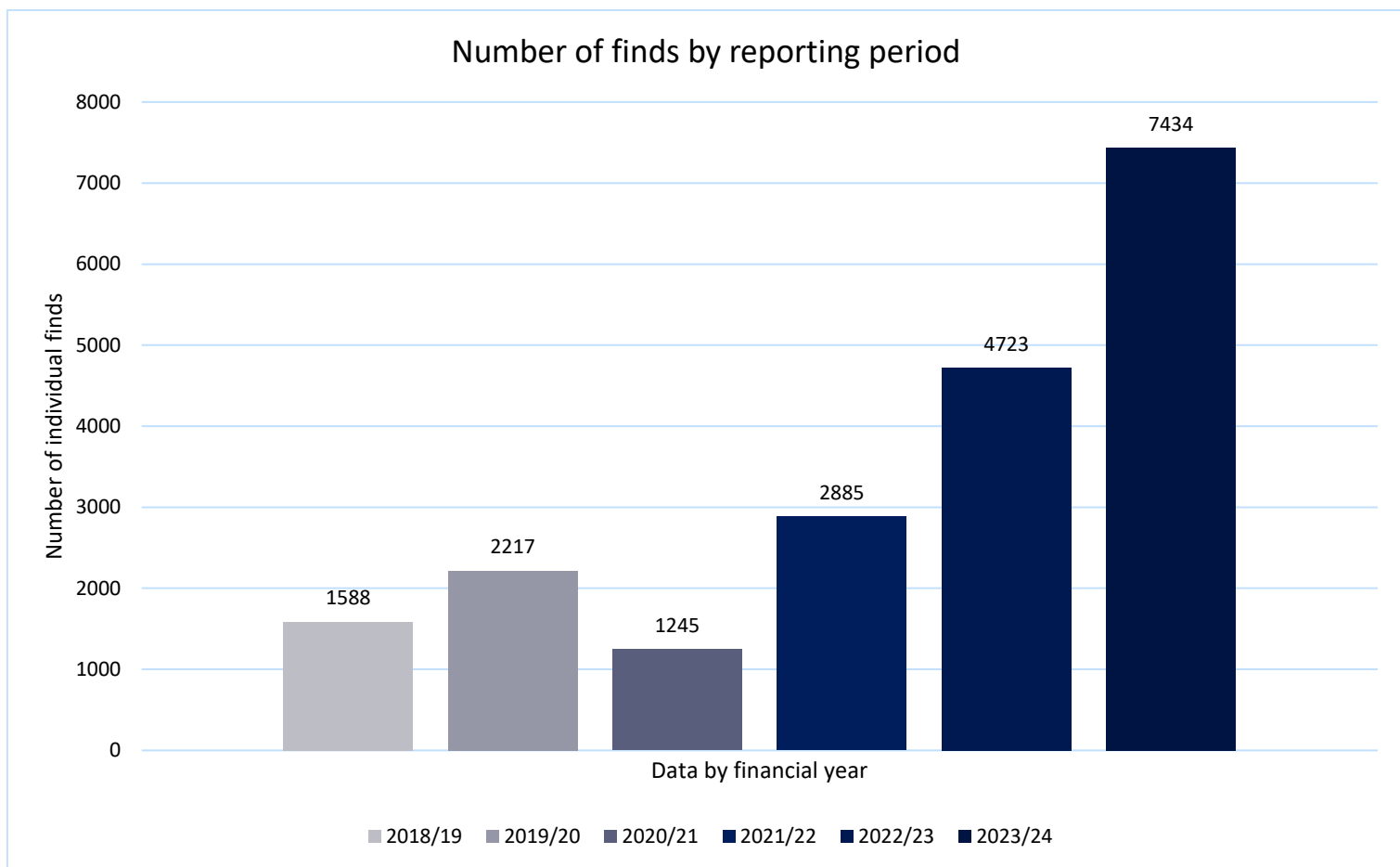
Graph: number of chance find (CF) and excavation assemblage (EA) cases allocated and disclaimed at SAFAP.

As part of the Treasure Trove process, finders of objects are routinely offered an ex gratia award (funded by the acquiring museum) which is linked to the market value of their find. In this reporting period the total sum paid to members of the public was £84,535. Individual payments ranged from £5 to £12,000. In five cases the finder waived or part-waived their ex gratia award.

In the same period, SAFAP considered 121 excavation assemblages reported by professional archaeologists. Of these, 56 were returned to the excavator as no museum wished to acquire them. Upon review, these cases contained predominantly Post-Medieval to modern artefacts of little archaeological value. As this material was recovered through research and professional fieldwork, no ex gratia award is paid in these cases.

Over this reporting period, the Treasure Trove Unit continued to implement the pandemic recovery plan. This included extending the three fixed-term Treasure Trove Officer posts (until March 2026), prioritising caseload based on the audit undertaken at the beginning of 2022 and increasing Treasure Trove visibility through increased finder meetings and outreach events.

During this reporting period, TTU were hosted by museums in Aberdeen, Dundee, Dunfermline, Elgin, Glasgow, Inverness, Melrose, Montrose, Orkney (various) and Shetland (various). One metal detecting club was also attended. Other museums were visited for the unit to drop off allocated cases and pick-up finds made by members of the public, including Ayr, Cromarty, Elgin, Hamilton, Melrose, Nairn and Paisley.



Graph: number of artefacts handed in by finders to the TTU during the reporting period specified. This only includes finds held by the TTU and does not include excavation assemblages. Note: the 2022/23 figure does not include a hoard of 8,416 coins so as not to skew the graph.

Although there were challenges, the Treasure Trove Unit continued to strive for efficient and transparent working. From April 2023 to March 2024, Treasure Trove Unit staff received 7,434 chance finds. 228 chance finds cases were claimed, representing 1,438 finds; three of these were disclaimed at panel, totalling 269 finds. Approximately 4,651 artefacts were not claimed and were returned to finders.

Four excavations to follow up interesting discoveries were undertaken in Scottish Borders, Western Isles, Dumfries and Galloway, and Perth and Kinross in partnership with National Museums Scotland, Historic Environment Scotland and AOC Archaeology archaeologists. The finds recovered from these sites include a Roman vessel hoard, Early Medieval silver arm rings from two different sites, and a Roman denarii hoard. Processing of the excavation assemblages is ongoing.

Interesting cases

Prehistoric and Roman

Two socketed axeheads and a gold bracelet found together in the parish of St Cyrus, Aberdeenshire. Whilst socketed axeheads are frequently seen coming through the Treasure Trove system, the bracelet is a much more unusual find. It is probably unfinished as there are visible hammer marks and other examples, such as in the Hillhead hoard and the Heights of Brae hoard, have shaped terminals.

TT 298/22: Gold Medieval finger ring, allocated to Smith Art Gallery and Museum The inscription, in French, appears to be *mon plesir l'est*, which translates roughly to 'my pleasure is'.

There are three floral sprays engraved around the outer band; one between each word. The ring has a rather small internal diameter of 15.6mm, suggesting that it probably belonged to a woman. The nature of the inscription and decoration suggest that it is a love ring, probably given as a token of affection or love.

Post-Medieval to Modern



TT 287/22: Post-Medieval coin hoard,
allocated to Perth Museum and Art Gallery

Early Bronze Age tanged and barbed arrowhead mounted in a 17th – 18th century silver frame, allocated to Aberdeenshire Museums Service. Such repurposing of archaeological and natural specimens in this way became popular in the late 17th century onwards.

These composite items appeared to be examples of Scottish folk apotropaic magic (warding off elf/fairy mischief), and the inscription on this example is evocative of a good-luck charm.

The possible meaning is: 'If ever I [should] fall, I'll thank God of all'. The posy is in keeping with a charm to ward off misfortune (ie. a 'fall' be it literal or metaphorical), calling on the power of God to protect the wearer.

Allocation Procedures

Appendix 2 contains Flow Charts which illustrate:

- (1) the procedures followed between the reporting of a chance find and the paying out of the *ex-gratia* payment and allocation of the find to the museum; the typical time span for these various procedures is within 12 months from date of reporting; and
- (2) the process in relation to items recovered in the course of an archaeological dig.

Funding

The operational expenses of the SAFAP and TTU comprise mainly staff costs and administration costs which amounted to around £303,000. These costs are met partly by grant-in-aid from the Scottish Government to National Museums Scotland, which houses the TTU, and partly through funding from the KLTR.

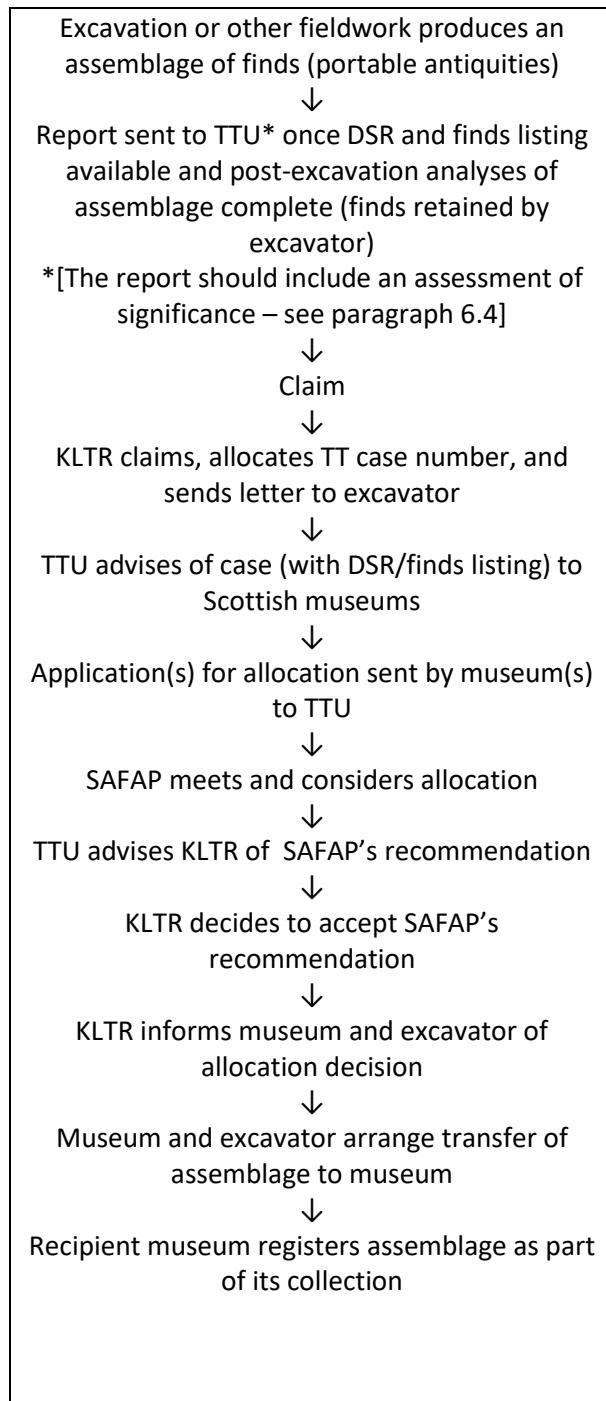
